DEMOCRAT POSITION

Believes 14th Amendment cancels out Religious liberty rights. Churches must submit to government anti religion laws

Believes religion is discriminatory and should not be practiced outside the church walls

Accepts a progressive vision of religious freedom that accepts pluralism where Christians must accept anti-Christian issues

Supports abortion at any time in a pregnancy and supports Planned Parenthood founder as a modern hero, even though she proposed reduced rates of reproduction for lesser races

Supports transgender and gender identity which means anyone can use any restroom or shower

REPUBLICAN POSITION

If God given, natural, inalienable rights come in conflict with government, court or human-granted rights, God given rights always prevail

Religion is a right promised by Nature's God but is also necessary to sustain a free society

Lists religious liberty, with its rights of conscience, as the first freedom to be protected. Right of people to practice their faith in their everyday lives. Religion and morality are indispensable supports to a free society.

Believes abortion is wrong and views targeting minorities for abortion as racist; sees abortion as a modern genocide

Believes that the sex on your birth certificate determines the bathroom or shower you use

DEMOCRAT POSITION

Gay rights cancel religious liberty and Christians can be sued for not supporting gay rights

Opposes any protection for people of faith and religious schools must comply with any and all alternative lifestyle practices and indeed must teach them

Believes it is not freedom of religion but freedom of worship which means people of faith can't practice their faith outside of church

Rejects the misuse of religion to discriminate meaning Christians can't practice their faith if they don't support alternative lifestyles

Believes Religious Liberty is a code term for bigotry and should be silenced

REPUBLICAN POSITION
